## **Yo! Game Directions**

Here's how you play the Yo-game: The Yo-game is a fun and exciting educational way to reinforce the YoPlace lesson each week

At the start of class each player is given ONE game sheet and one Yobill for attending

The Yo-game sheet is played in a similar manner to Bingo and Tic-Tack-Toe

Each game sheet has a series of letters on them.

The series of letters is different on most of the sheets.

Only the sheets which have the same picture in the upper right hand corner are identical.

Generally speaking it is best if each player has a different game sheet and therefore a different picture
